4-H PROJECT/RESOURCE BOOK REMINDERS

Uniform Rules for 4-H Horse Shows

The revised state uniform rule books are available in the Extension Office (\$6.00 each if purchased by a 4-H club). The latest version is dated 2021.

Equine Record Book (#190R)

Remember, this is required for projects 175, 177, 180, 181, 182, 184, 185, 188, 189 and 762. It is not needed for 174 because it has record sheets inside of the book. If an exhibitor is taking 174 Beginning Horse Management for multiple years, they will need to photocopy the record pages as indicated on page 162 of the project book.

Horses, Safety & You (#191R)

All first-time horse project participants should read 191R Horses, Safety and You. Books are available for purchase by club volunteers at the Extension Office for \$6.

Horse Education Program

All youth enrolled in a horse project (except Project #173 Horseless Horse) must complete a Muskingum County Horse Education Program.

Certification can be obtained in one of two ways:

1) Youth can participate in an in-person session provided by OSU Extension.

- Youth should plan to arrive early, as youth will not receive credit for attending if they arrive more than 10 minutes after the program starts. Attendance will be taken at the beginning and end of each session.
- Parent attendance is not required, but encouraged.

2) Youth can complete Ohio 4-H's EquiSTEP program.

The online course is housed on ScarletCanvas and is run by the State 4-H Office.

Enroll in the course: go.osu.edu/2022equistep

- Each member must sign up for the course with a unique e-mail address.
- Select 'Modules' to see the 5 steps.
- Watch the video(s) that correspond with each step.
- Complete the quiz associated with the training. You need to score at least a 7 out of 10 to pass the training.
- After scoring at least a 7 out of 10 on the quiz, complete the Certificate of Completion/Course Evaluation Survey. Both you and your county 4-H professional will be emailed a certificate that notes you have completed the EquiSTEP training.

NEW THIS YEAR! Derby Bucks Auction

The Junior Fair Horse Committee is hosting the first Derby Bucks Auction to benefit horse exhibitors! The Horse Committee is asking any club with horse projects to donate items to the Derby Bucks Auction and to invite potential buyers to the event on Tuesday, August 16 at 1 p.m. in the Horse Arena. Auction items can be horse specific (décor, tack & supplies, apparel, etc.) or not (gift cards, food items, etc.)

Proceeds from the auction will be divided among all horse exhibitors who will not receive money from the sale of a market animal or benefit from Bossy's Jug Auction (sale for dairy exhibitors). If a Junior Fair exhibitor shows more than one (1) species of livestock, he/she must designate to the Junior Fair Office which specie he/she plans to sell, immediately after the exhibitor's final show.

Equine Ambassador Contest

The Equine Ambassador Contest is open to any 4-H member in good standing who is enrolled in a horse project this year. There are Junior (8-13 years old) and Senior (14-18 years old) age divisions. **The deadline to apply is June 30, interviews/test will take place on July 20 at the Veteran's Building at the Fairgrounds.** Applicants must participate in Horse Skillathon. Horse Vaccination Clinic

Open to all youth with horse projects! June 15, 6-8 p.m., Muskingum County Fairgrounds near the Horse Arena. RSVP to Jayme Oler-Wisecarver (740-252-7190) by June 13. Cash payments ONLY. Shots will be administered by a local veterinarian.

- 5-way vaccination (required for fair) and exam: \$45
- West Nile (optional) \$30
- Rabies (optional) \$15

Fair Entry Guidelines

- Junior Fair Horse Show Days at Muskingum County Fair: Tuesday, August 16 & Wednesday, August 17. The show bill is included in this packet.
- Members may only exhibit 1 (one) horse (excluding production).
- Members may only show their own project animal.
- First Year Classes – First year showmanship is for first year members who have not shown in a halter class at a county fair before. They may take their grade in this class if desired.
- Livestock entries must be submitted online in Fair Entry (muskingum.fairentry.com) by established deadlines, **NO EXCEPTIONS**. Fair Entry opens June 6. All animal entries are due online by June 30 except market rabbits, which are due July 26. **ALL Horse registrations will be due June 30.** Please review the instructions before starting your entries: go.osu.edu/entryhelp.
- Animals exhibited at the fair must be given a grade by the judge during the official class for the animal to receive a grade. 4-H members may show a horse in as many classes as they wish (as eligible by age or size), but will be required to designate their grade class on the entry. Grade ribbons will be distributed as youth leave the arena for their designated grade class. Entries for all other classes will be taken at the show.

- 5-way vaccination by a veterinarian is required for all horses age yearling and older to be administered by August 1. Exhibitor must submit documentation of vaccination to the Junior Fair Horse Committee at the entry booth on Day 1 of the Muskingum County Fair by the end of the 12:30 p.m. barn meeting. Any horse that does not have a vaccination record submitted by this time will be dismissed from the grounds.
- All Junior Fair Horses must undergo a Body Condition Score (BCS) evaluation by the fair horse veterinarian on the first day of the Muskingum County Fair. Any horse that does not have an adequate BCS will be dismissed from the grounds. Note: The Horse Committee suggests that exhibitors have their horse(s) evaluated by their veterinarian when they administer required vaccinations.

Other Fair Information

- Livestock trailers, as well as horse trailers, will not be permitted to remain on the fairgrounds or fairgrounds parking lots during the fair.
- To assist in keeping fair week smooth, the committee is asking that adults refrain from riding project animals during the fair. An exception would be a dangerous behavior problem with the animal.
- 4-H volunteers are to stress to members there should not be any riding double on horses at the fair.
- Exercise schedules will be posted at the arena. The arena must be cleared by 7:30 a.m. on Tuesday and Wednesday due to the shows. Members are to exercise horses only in the arena during designated hours.
- There will be a barn meeting on **Sunday, August 14 at 12:30 p.m.** A Grand Opening Ceremony for Saddle Horse Clubs will be held in the horse arena following the barn meeting on Sunday. The Horse Committee highly recommends no horses participate in the Muskingum County Junior Parade.
- Judge's Meetings – at the arena 20 minutes prior to show time.
- State Fair Representatives will be presented their awards during the awards program at 4:45 p.m. on Sunday of the fair. State Fair representatives will not ride their horses through to receive awards

PAS Show (Ohio State Fair Qualifier)

- The State Fair Qualifying (PAS) Show is Saturday, June 18, starting at 9:00 a.m. at the Muskingum County Fairgrounds. The show bill is included in this packet.
- Youth must register for the PAS Show online by June 15 at 11:59 p.m. Entry form: go.osu.edu/muskingumpas.
- The Ohio State Fair Horse Show is July 18-22. For more information, visit: ohio4h.org/events/ohio-state-fair-junior-horse-show.
- Each youth is responsible for entering their classes and paying their stall fee online at www.ohiostatefair.com/livestock. The entry deadline is July 1 @ 1:00 p.m. Youth must submit a copy of the current negative Coggins test (dated after January 1, 2022) in their 4-H Online profile under the Animals tab (this is separate from the Muskingum County Junior Fair entry). Instructions for submitting the Coggins test will be shared with those who qualify.

General Rules

1. Youth must qualify to attend the State Fair. There is no guaranteed number given to a county.
2. A youth must qualify in a minimum of two classes in order to go to State Fair, but can show in a maximum of four classes. At State Fair, youth will only show in classes they qualified for during a PAS Show. There is no statewide restriction on the number of classes in which a youth may try and qualify. **Youth should pay attention to the State Fair Show program and what classes you cannot enter due to show scheduling conflicts. At State Fair, classes will not be delayed for people with conflicting classes.** Measurements will be taken at the PAS show in Zanesville and at the Ohio State Fair. Exhibitors who have animals that are of incorrect size for the entered class will be moved to the correct class.
3. Youth can go to another county, but the following rules apply:
 - A. A youth cannot compete in more than two PAS shows or one PAS show with two judges.
 - B. The reason must be acceptable to the 4-H Educators in both counties involved. Youth requesting to participate in another county must make their request as early as possible, due to registration dates each county has to prepare for the show.
 - C. **Out-of-County PAS Form:** As in the past, the 4-H educator must approve and sign the out-of-county PAS form that the 4-H member will take with them to the out-of-county PAS show. Please call the Extension Office ahead (740-454-0144) to make arrangements for Jamie to sign your out-of-county form. **Starting this year, the 4-H member is responsible for uploading their completed form(s) to their 4-H Online profile under the Animals tab by the July 1 deadline.** The youth will pay the county to which they go a minimum of \$10 per class entered to cover the costs of their participation. 4. Reminder of rules as you select classes:
 - A. Youth cannot qualify in Ranch Pleasure and Western Pleasure at the same show.
 - B. Youth cannot qualify in Trail and Trail in Hand at the same show.
 - C. Youth cannot show at the State Fair Junior Horse Show in Intermediate Equitation Over Fences and Advanced Equitation Over Fences.
 - D. Youth cannot show at the State Fair Junior Horse Show in Low Hunter Over Fences and Working/Regular Over Fences.
5. Bits: 4-H participants should be aware that the proper bits must be used and will be checked prior to showing. Bits will also be checked at state fair. Improper bits will disqualify the member. Refer to the Uniform Horse Rule Book for guidelines.
6. The member and animals must be clean and member properly dressed in western attire. This means western shirt, boots, etc., as listed in the Uniform Rule Book. All members are required to have proper dress (no t-shirts, ball caps, sneakers, etc.) and equipment. Improper equipment will result in disqualification. Helmets are required.

The following policy is stated in the State Uniform Rules for 4-H Horse Shows and will be in effect for the Muskingum County Fair, Muskingum County PAS Show (State Fair qualifier), Ohio State Fair and all Ohio 4-H equine events.

All youth age 19 and under, participating in any 4-H equestrian activity, are required to wear properly fitted protective headgear which meets or exceeds current ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards with the chin harness securely fastened at all times while riding or driving an equine.
